## Georgia 4-H Base Programming

### Chicken Barbecue Contest

#### Description of Learning Experience:

The 4-H Chicken Barbecue Contest is designed to develop skills in the use and preparation of chicken. Safe preparation and good food hygiene are the primary goals. Participants barbecue two 1 1/4 to 1 1/2 pound chicken halves within the time limit. Participants also present a ten minute illustrated presentation including factual information about broilers.

#### Learning Outcomes:

- Develop leadership skills and work toward achieving broad objectives of developing sound character and effective citizenship.
- Acquire scientific knowledge and improved understanding of the economy, versatility and nutritional value of chicken broiler meat and its relationship to human nutrition and health.
- Develop skills in the preparation and use of chicken and acquire the ability to express their ideas through participation in projects, talks, discussions, demonstrations and exhibits.
