Workshop Title: Bow, Shake, Hands or Just Shrug

Describe your class. What will participants do? What will participants learn? We will learn all about how to greet and introduce people in different groups. We will also learn how to tell when someone with a title or other rank enters a room and who to introduce first. We will also talk about writing notes to say thanks and just for fun we will learn a few social dances.

What experiences have you had as an instructor or teacher? Describe other classes you have taught or assisted with? I am teaching from part of my 4-H presentation. I also am a teacher with an etiquette and leadership school in my county and I teach fifth-eighth graders once a month the same topics. I have taught at junior conference the last two years and helped at our 4-H Day Camp teaching classes on making introductions and writing thank you notes.

Why would you like to serve as an instructor for 4-H Fall Forum? I really like the topic and think others will like it too. Plus, it's good practice for me to teach others since I have to do this for work. My agent says it will look good in my portfolio too.

What experiences do you have with the topic you are teaching (learning as well as sharing opportunities you may have had) This is my 4-H project. I've done ten different presentations on the topic and I've been teaching it for two years. I also added classes for four years in the area. I'm on student council and I have to help with school functions introducing teachers and visitors so I get to practice what I teach.

What challenges might you encounter as you teach this class? The topic might not sound exciting so there might be people who don't want to participate and that means I'll have to work at getting them excited.

Please describe in outline form what will take place in class. What will you do, what will participants do, etc? You may add additional pages.

- 5 minutes Introduction & warm up...shake hands and say a fact about you switch name tags. Everyone ends up with a partner and has to talk to them to learn more about them.
- 15 minutes Stay with partners while I review some interesting facts about the history of protocol and why we have ways we do things. We will then practice introductions of each other. Group will mingle while each person introduces partner to someone new and shares some facts.
- 10 minutes Discuss exercise and how it is to introduce each other. Introduce a line dance & teach steps. Practice line dance
- 5 minutes Hand out badges of honor and discuss how to introduce someone with titles. Everyone will roll place a different person & take turns introduce each other.
- 10 minutes Thank you note presentation—what are the parts of a thank you note puzzle will be done & then groups will practice writing a thank you note
- 10 minutes Learn a new line dance (if partners will work will do the shag)
- 5 minutes Review what we did & best parts of class, will introduce each other to entire group as badge of honor character or as self and share something that was learned
