



Teambuilding and Leadership

Activities which require some participation on the part of actors, and exercise teambuilding and leadership skills.

Discovery of Fire

How to Play: Participants are divided into small groups of approximately 4-5. Each group then has a limited amount of time to develop a skit, which shows how they believe fire was discovered in prehistoric times. The only catch- Prehistoric man didn't speak English, so actors must speak in their own imaginary language.

Commercial

How to Play: Participants are divided into small groups and asked to come up with a fictitious product. The team then devises a slogan, jingle and commercial for their product.

Fortune Cookie

How to Play: Participants are divided into small groups. Each group receives a fortune cookie, and must create and present a skit that uses the fortune in some way (eg: theme of the skit, and event that takes place in the skit, etc.).

MacGuyver

How to Play: Groups of four-five are given three unrelated objects (e.g. A magnifying glass, a rubber boot, and a banana) and the name of a disaster (e.g. Tornado). They create a skit in which they save their town from the disaster using those three items.

Newspaper Skits

How to Play: Small groups of participants are each given a bag containing seven unrelated words cut out of a newspaper. They must use at least five of these words to create a newspaper headline, and then create and present a skit displaying the event/issue the newspaper article was about.

Skit in a Bag

How to Play: Divide the group into groups of 4-5. Have a brown grocery bag full of funny, misc. items you find around your house for each group. Have one member of the group come up and pick a bag, but they are not allowed to know what is inside it. Say "go". They take the bag back to the group and come up with a skit and be ready to present in five minutes.
